Join us in putting Leonard Bernstein's words into action, by making a meaningful difference in the lives of so many with the **healing power of music**. Music brings us together, calms our souls, engages our minds, and instills a sense of hope, especially when personal and worldly events can completely overwhelm us.

In 2023, Jazz & Classics for Change (JCfC) brought live music to our communities in Columbia and Berkshire counties with

not only **5 public concerts** but also **7 outreach concerts**: "music in action" initiatives that bring the gift of live music to those unable to come to us. Presently, these outreach audiences include young adults and adults with special abilities, seniors in assistant living homes, and the children of incarcerated parents.

In 2024, our public concerts will be performed again at Tydeman Farm in May and September, with a stellar group of musicians including violinist Eugene Drucker (founder of the famed Emerson String Quartet), cellist Roberta Cooper, and members of the Orchestra of St. Luke's. Grammy nominated clarinetist Anat Cohen and Marcello Gonçalves will join us in the Fall at Saint James Place in Great Barrington, Massachusetts. In 2024 we also plan to offer as many as 12 outreach concerts, and hope to bring live concerts to those in correctional facilities.
